

hat a good night everyone had at our Bargain Sale Opening, on Monday last- February 16th. Thanks to the extremely hard work by Eileen Mackley-our President, as well as the Office staff, Treasurer Ray Wilson as M.C. Volunteers and Council Members - it is felt that this Opening was the best for years.

Around one hundred and fifty people attended and appreciated the many works for sale – strong and diverse paintings and sculpture from established artists as well as new members of the Society.

The standard of work this year was tremendously high – regardless of style- and for the first time all entries by each artist were placed together.

Visually this created a pleasing and uniform look and a number of artists since, have commented on how strong all the exhibits looked presented this way.

Bidders purchased generously and particularly enjoyed the first part of the evening – the 'Silent Bidding'.

This was followed by an Auction of three beautiful works donated by Ray Hewitt, Mary Hyde and Julian Bruere – all "Artist of the Year' winners, over the last three years.

The Auctioneer was Andrew Ryan. He conducted quite an entertaining and lively interlude and the money raised from this Auction goes towards our Restoration Fund.

After the Auction – all works were for sale at marked prices – so there was a further 45 minutes during which buyers could purchase at leisure, whilst enjoying refreshments and cool drinks.

We all on Council, spent many hours of planning and discussion leading up to the Opening and took a great deal of time with the hanging process.

Every entry is valued at the Bargain Sale, not one work is excluded and not one artist favoured more than another.

It is a special night for Members – the chance to sell and be seen.

The biggest acknowledgement must go to President Eileen Mackley for her leadership, overall planning and tireless work.

A great evening and a great beginning to 2015.



NOEL WAITE



• Now Noel, you yourself have interviewed quite a lot of the Friday artists

So, I ask you, what is YOUR favourite question? And what would be YOUR answer?

A What is your motivation for painting portraits?

The model is in front of you, where or how do you start?

Many experienced painters quickly draft out a figure or face without hesitation. The result may be accurate and competent, yet often there is something lacking.

Is it sensitivity, empathy, or the magical, indefinable quality, called 'soul'? When that quality is in place, it can be the painting which instantly draws the viewer to the subject.

Observation is the key. My hint is to stand back for a short or even longer time to observe the key elements of the person and the pose. Then start work with confidence. It can be a winner!

- You were president at the Vics for some time weren't you Noel. Do you feel you did good? Could you do it all again?
- A I was president for 3 years after John Hunt which was a hard act to follow and was very challenging. I believe it was very rewarding. As an artist it can be a difficult task to concentrate on ensuring that a virtually self-funded organisation can only survive if it can 'pay its way'. This we did as a team and initiating the 'People Painting People' certainly played a big part in financing activities over the past 6 years of operation.

Yes. I would do it all again (family and art permitting).

- When did you start painting Noel?
- A Ever since I can remember, I was drawing and colouring. There were few paints if any in my very early days. I won a colouring competition which was advertised on the radio, and school prizes for drawing. However I was accepted at Swinburne Art School and had an exciting four years full-time. We had very little equipment after the war but had wonderful teachers such as Laurie Pendlebury and a short while with Nornie Gude.
- Were you always a watercolourist?
- A I guess in some way, watercolour was predominant in my life although I enjoyed pen and wash as a Fashion Illustrator for K.

 O. Geiger, The Myer Emporium for six years before free lancing for them on a retainer while having 4 children. I worked because I loved it and always tried to improve. Later on I tried working on ceramics and silk and a few years ago joined Lee Machelak's Portrait Classes in oil painting. I've enjoyed three overseas trips with Charles Reid, an exceptional watercolourist from America, and feel very privileged to do so. Watercolouring was my love although I did a lot of investigation into other mediums. And yes, I did try oil-painting but am very sensitive to solvents and therefore, have not concentrated on it at this stage rather I have concentrated on conte crayon for portraits. Watercolour is my other medium for landscapes, portraits and still life studies I love the translucency and sensitivity to the subjects attained via watercolour.
- Going back a few years Noel, I remember your 2013 retrospective at The Lyceum Club. Quite an extensive show with over 30 works.

What periods of your artistic output did it cover? Did you have a favourite painting in the show? Was there a favourite painting time in your life?

AO FVAS AN INTERVIEW BY RAFFAELLA TORRESAN

- A It was a retrospective from the 60's to the present, but it is difficult to pick a particular time.
 - I believe in lifetime learning as any artist worth their salt is constantly revising, absorbing and creating anew from inspirations around - nature, environment, and above all, people whose expressions and impressions fascinate me. I have worked with people and about people all my working life. As you now, I took over the small family business and brought in some innovative and creative ideas for career development - especially for women. My book 'The Gold Within' Creative Careers for Women, was published in the year 2000. I also organized programs for women throughout Australia.
 - My favourite painting (to get back to your question), in the retrospective was the conte crayon drawing of my daughter Debbie with my first granddaughter titled Laura's First Day.
- You have had serious personal trials to overcome in your time haven't you Noel? A car accident that left you needing extensive facial surgery, and the death of your first husband. Your art must have been a great consolation to you during these times.
- A I guess the art was always, but after the initial shock, subsided somewhat, vanity took over and, as I told the wonderful British Surgeon, 'I don't need to look like Elizabeth Taylor on my return, I just want the children to know their mother'. They did and I have a wonderful supportive family.
- **Q** Do you think that for artists, their art/passion, as with you, will see them through?
- A I know of a number of women who have experienced remarkable lives due to their exceptional painting ability and art profession. Our own Joyce McGrath is an excellent example of this.
- You have been organizing and participating in the best run, weekend long, multi portrait painting event, since 2008 (the centenary of the Womens' Vote in Australia). You are now, again back with the People Painting People weekend and this year it falls on Saturday 16 May and Sunday 17 May.
 - A huge yearly project which takes about 6 months to organize.

Given your present difficulties at home - that is, you're husband's operation, how do you find the time and energy for the organization required?

- A We have an excellent President, Eileen Mackley who has put together a small Committee to take over the workload. I have promised to act as an Adviser this time, to select the painters and sitters and to participate as a painter on the two days. As we get nearer to the event, we need support from members and the general public to attend and to help make it a success.
- And finally Noel, was that your 'best hat forward' I've painted you wearing, at the Friday class? Or just a momentary fancy pansy?
- A Raff, you know the hat was one of those fancy 'props' from on top of the studio cupboard. You happened to have your camera at the time.

It was the latter I think and the lights captured shining in my eyes were studio glitter.

> Thank you Noel, you have been terrific (as always), in answering all of the above.





Jo Reitze PUTS SOME COLOUR IN YOUR LIFE

Shown on Channel 74 TV4ME on Sunday, 15 February at 8pm. Put some Colour in Your Life is a popular television series on artists. The programme was created by its CEO, the Master Artist and Film Maker, Graeme Stevenson. Stevenson has interviewed many prominent artists throughout Australia and New Zealand and is soon to film in USA. His vision is to build a library of the minds of artists; to preserve a digital record of creative spirit, culture and techniques for future generations.

Whereas most artists are interviewed and demonstrate in their studios, Reitze has chosen to return to Cloudehill for the filming. She will demonstrate a gouache impression of the view from the shelter of the marquee. It is Reitze's practice to compete works on location 'en plein air' Reitze is looking forward to demonstrating in this medium which is unfamiliar to many. She finds it has the vibrancy of oils without the mess or slow drying properties.

These qualities also makes it ideal to use when travelling.

In 2009, as Artist in Residence at Cloudehill, Reitze commenced a series of impressions of Cloudehill in gouache. She strove to capture the essence of this magnificent hillside garden.

Most of the sixteen paintings were completed in that year with more added in 2010 and 2011.

They capture different aspects of Cloudehill in all seasons. Cloudehill is a glorious Olinda garden, justly regarded as Australia's finest. It is the realization of the vision of Jeremy Francis, its owner and creator. For more than twenty years, he has carefully selected plants, colours and textures to enhance the natural environment, creating beautiful compositions that require no artistic licence from the painter. Man made structures such as paths, walls, sculptures and pots enrich the organic shapes and patterns of foliage and flowers. For Reitze this is a garden artist's paradise.

Reitze established "Jo Reitze paints your Garden" in 2005. Since then she has immortalized many gardens. She has enjoyed painting in beautiful places and meeting lovely people who share her passion for gardening. It has enabled her to maintain social contact and to give others such pleasure. Her paintings are noted for their vibrant colour and lyrical mark making. Colours are often enhanced by strong tonal contrast. As in nature green hues unify her compositions.

Close view points with clearly recognizable plants and structures captures the essence of the particular spot and makes the viewers feel enclosed in a beautiful environment. Glimpses of vistas beyond create the illusion of space and suggest the vastness of such gardens.

Jo Reitze (Mrs de Carteret) is a Fellow of The Victorian Artists Society and President of Melbourne Society of Women Painters & Sculptors. She was formerly Art Coordinator at Canterbury Girls' Secondary College (1985 – 2005). She has received numerous art awards and commendations over the years, In 2005 she established Jo Reitze paints your Garden.

In 2008 Reitze painted twenty Booroondara Gardens for Surrey Hills Neighbourhood Centre's 'Beyond the garden wall project that showed the significance of gardening for the well being of older people. In 2013 Reitze was Whitehorse Artspace invited artist and her exhibition The Artist's Garden, showcased images of her Surrey Hills garden, a reoccurring themes of her oeuvre for over twenty five years. Reitze is represented in many Civic collections in Australia and private collections in Australia and overseas.


