Charcoal and Watercolour 2 Days Workshop with It Hao Pheh Wednesday 19th April and Thursday 20th of April 2023

There are a few incidental items you will need to bring with you when we begin. These can be purchased at THE ART SHOP - 12/21 Power Road, Bayswater or SENIOR ART SUPPLIES - 1310 Malvern Rd Malvern.

Drawing (Charcoal)

(1) Charcoal*: preferably FABER CASTELL, Natural Charcoal Sticks 6 Pack (Officeworks),

or others with similar quality

(2) Paper*: ACHES or SAUNDERS watercolour paper 300gsm, 380mm x 560mm (Half

Sheet) HP Smooth or others with similar in size, preferably Natural White - 2

pieces - 2 pieces

(3) Eraser: FABER CASTELL Kneadable/Putty Eraser

(4) Blender: Paper Stump/Blending Smudge tool, larger stumps often works better

(5) Fixative: a workable matt fixative, preferably MICADOR

(6) Others: Drawing Board, Masking Tape

(7) Pastels: Provided(8) Photo Reference: Provided

Watercolour

(1) Watercolour Paints*: Suggestion of my colour choice from "Schmincke": Paris Blue, French

Ultramarine, Mountain Blue, Schmincke Violet, Helio Cerulean/Peacock Blue, Transparent Orange, Spinel Brown/Burnt Sienna, Olive Green Yellowish, Sepia Brown, Cadmium Yellow Deep, and Titanium Opaque White. (Others brands like Winsor & Newton Cotman, Daniel Smith, Holbein,

Rembrandt)

(2) Brushes: Size 12 round Synthetic brush (Escoda Perla Synthetic Round, my favourite)

and 1.5in or 40mm Hake / flat brush, or something similar in size and quality.

(3) Paper*: Highly Recommended Arches 300gsm Rough 56cm x 38cm, which means a

full sheet of watercolour paper may be cut into 2 pieces (Half Sheet). Alternatively, if you prefer watercolour pads, be sure the quality and size should be around A2 size (depending on manufacturer). Preferably Rough

surface.

(4) Pencils: 2B, 3B or 4B (recommended Staedtler Mars Lumograph)

(5) Board: Hardboard, Corrugated Plastic Board, Plywood... My choice is Plywood

Hardwood Marine AA Grade 4mm from Bunning. Enable you to paint on an

angle easily.

(6) Masking Tape: Important to have one, to keep your paper from buckling. Often I tape it all

round. Normally I don't stretch my paper, but is totally fine if you prefer that

wav.

(7) Palette: Preferebly Folding (Plastic or Metal). Generally comes with 5 larger mixing

wells and 20 to 30 smaller sloping for individual colours holding.

(8) Others: Spray bottle, drying towel, tissues, eraser, notepad and "magic sponge" and

etc.

(9) Photo Reference: Provided.
