Welcome! This class will be operated in a supervised studio-style environment, where students will be encouraged to follow their own artistic interests and hone their skills. The class will feature demonstrations and weekly exercises, with a curriculum-based approach for students who are beginners or want more support. For those who are more confident, the teacher will provide one-on-one guidance and support during the course. As a teacher, my aim is to create an encouraging, open atmosphere with the appropriate instruction and assistance for each student's individual needs.

Materials list for students

Please feel free to bring any acrylic materials you may already have. If you need to buy materials, here is a suggested shopping list:

- Sketchbook
- Pencil(s) and erasers
- Ruler
- Masking tape (I like the Scotch Blue painter's tape)
- Jar for rinsing water
- Palette knife
- Spray bottle for misting
- Paper towels and/or clean rags
- Palette disposable palette paper or non-porous reusable palette (I like glass palettes)
- Mix of soft bristle brushes (I like 1-3cm flat brushes, plus smaller round detail brushes)
- Painting surfaces:
 - 300gsm canvas or acrylic paper
 - Primed canvas
 - Primed MDF board
 - Primed wood panel
- High-quality acrylic paints (I prefer Matisse Structure or Golden)
 - <u>Cool primaries and warm primaries</u> (i.e. cool red/yellow/blue and warm red/yellow/blue) -- if you're unsure, any combination of red/yellow/blue is great to start with
 - Titanium white
 - Burnt sienna
 - Payne's grey or Ivory black
- Mediums/additives, e.g. drying retarder, gel medium, slow-drying medium, GAC 100 (if you're unsure, wait until after the first class to decide what will work best for your style)
