VAS ARTIST OF THE YEAR AWARD

SPONSORED BY THE MACKLEY FAMILY

The VAS Artist of the Year Award is sponsored by Eileen Mackley AM VAS FVAS and Hylton Mackley AM.

Prize money for 2023 will be \$10,000 with an increase in value to 2035 when the prize money is planned to reach circa \$23,000.

Eileen and Hylton have been a formidable team who have played a major role in guiding VAS through some of its most difficult times, including closing during the pandemic, and the urgently needed restoration of the heritage listed building.

Eileen joined VAS in 1993 and in 2013 was elected as President of VAS, becoming the fifth woman to hold the position since 1870. Eileen implemented many changes including extra studio classes, new exhibitions, corporate sponsorship, and the commencement of the extensive renovation program.

Hylton has played a significant role for many years in guiding VAS down a successful financial path to a sustainable future. His business life has been predominantly in the advertising industry, with the emphasis on management and directorship on many Company Boards. Being nominated VAS Treasurer in 2016 he was instrumental in guiding VAS through the restoration programme of the building, ensuring finances were in a sound position to support the project.

MEMBERS' CHOICE AWARD

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The Members' Choice Award, sponsored by 'U do Website Builder' is a free website to the value of \$1650. This is awarded to the artist gaining the most votes from non-exhibiting members throughout the year.

EXHIBITORS' CHOICE AWARD

The Exhibitors' Choice Award, sponsored by Noel Waite AO is a \$500 prize awarded to the artist gaining the most votes from the exhibiting members who are exhibiting in the Artist of the Year exhibition.



SARAH ACKLAND

Sarah Ackland is an Australian artist who currently works primarily in graphite, but also has a love for watercolour. With an interest in bush scenes, landscape and botanical, she is constantly inspired by the Australian landscape, the plant life and its rugged beauty.

MARK BAGALLY

A full-time artist from Torquay Victoria, Mark Bagally is a representational marine and landscape painter in both oil and watercolour.

SUSANNAH BOND

An emerging artist specialising in seascapes and still life through semi abstract oil painting on canvas and inspired by minimalist artists of the 20th Century. Susannah loves to work with oils because blending the rich pigments and deep colours results in beautiful textured outcomes on the canvas with brush and knife.

JULIAN BRUERE VAS FVAS

As a painter and teacher with VAS for many years, Julian looks forward each year to the Vics showcase AOTY Exhibition. This year he has entered works that show his interests in Landscape, Marine and Alpine Snow Gums. These three topics continue to sustain his watercolour interests.

RACHEL DETTMANN-SMITH VAS

Living and working in rural Victoria, the natural environment and changing landscape influences much of what Rachel creates.

Painting from life has become essential to her practice, and in particular it has given her a new appreciation and love for portraiture and still life painting.

DIANA EDWARDS

Diana has been painting and teaching oil and watercolour for the past 30 years. She has held many solo and joint exhibitions and won many Best in Show awards since 1987, including the Alice Bale oil painting award in 1982 and The Notable Women of Nillumbik in 2010, for 18 years of service to the Arts. In 2017 she won the Australian Art Excellence Award at AGRA. Diana is represented in Australian and overseas collections.

'What inspires me and draws me to paint my chosen subject is the light. Light transforms the ordinary into something extraordinary. It's that heartfelt magic that I try to convey in my paintings. Much of my painting is en plein-air—that is when I find my greatest connection to my subject.'

LOUISE FOLETTA VAS

These paintings have been inspired by Louise's love of the vast Australian landscape and her close observations of intimate areas on her property at Buxton. Louise is not interested in capturing the light of the traditional landscapes—rather she attempts to capture the contrasting harshness and beauty, the texture and rhythm at both levels of magnification.

MELISSA FRASER VAS

Melissa is an oil painter with a contemporary figurative style, best known for her lively still lifes, and large landscapes.

'My aim is to evoke a response from the viewer, conveying a feeling, an atmosphere, an expression of the subject matter rather than a copy of it.'

ADAM FRITH

Adam Frith has held a keen interest in Melbourne's art history since his teenage years, having been inspired by family connection. An avid follower of the work and methods of Max Meldrum and associated students, he studied with Don James at Montsalvat and the studio of the late Alan Martin during the 1990s.

IT HAO PHEH

In 1991, It Hao Pheh received a full scholarship to study at the Malaysian Institute of Art, majoring in oil painting. He has an honours degree in Fine Art at the Surrey Institute of Art and Design, UK.

RAY HEWITT VAS FVAS

Ray Hewitt was born in 1947 and lived in Newport for most of his life. Ray went to the North Williamstown state school then the Williamstown Technical School which is where he attended his first art class of an evening using oil paints. He has always been fascinated about art and was inspired by his father.

In the early 1980s Ray started thinking more seriously about art. He did a couple of years with Lance McNeil then joined VAS and studied with Shirley Bourne. He later taught for 15 years before stepping down due to health reasons.

Out of all the genres of painting, plein air has to be his first choice. There is nothing like being out in the landscape and painting.

BRONWEN HUNT

Bronwen has a studio located in the North East of Melbourne. She works primarily in oils and whilst remaining largely figurative she pays homage to contemporary art theory.

MARY HYDE VAS

Mary Hyde is an oil painter with a high regard for outdoor painting and studio work. Her work demonstrates a strong understanding of tonal values with a sensitive and efficient colour usage. Gentle brush work with rich warmth and colour are hallmarks of her painting style. Mary enjoys painting an array of subject matter, landscape, marine, figure/portraiture and still-life.

DON JAMES VAS FVAS

Born in Melbourne, Don is a tonal realist oil painter and has been a resident artist and teacher at Montsalvat since 1992. A Fellow of the Victorian Artists Society, he has taught the elements of Tonal Realist Oil Painting since 1982, publishing his book, *On Painting* in 2007.

ANNE MELLOY VAS AGRAF PSVA

Anne is a Melbourne based exhibiting artist in both watercolour and pastel. Her style is Realist Impressionism and her landscapes generally feature water, mountains, snow and ice. Mood and light are key elements.

SUSAN MORRIS

Susan is a Melbourne based painter working mainly in oils. Her still life paintings reflect her love of Australian flora. Susan has taken part and been a finalist in numerous group shows across Australia since 2019.

TJ MURPHY VAS

Tim is an oil painter who attempts to record his visual experience. Inspiration initially came from visiting the Isle of Skye where the majesty of the observed landscape clearly differed from photographic depictions. Tim's approach centres on tone, with subtle manipulation of form and colour to direct the viewer's eye.

DES PARKIN VAS

A retired physician for whom painting has been a longtime leisure interest, Des Parkin was a student of Dudley Wood in the early seventies, since which time he has tried the patience of a variety of teachers.

He is an enthusiastic member of VAS which has given him a great deal of pleasure through art classes, exhibitions and many trips away.

ROBYN PRIDHAM VAS

Robyn studied life drawing and oil painting at the Victorian Artists Society prior to commencing formal studies at Victoria University, Diploma of Arts (Visual Arts) and Distinction at RMIT University, Melbourne. Robyn's work is an exploration of the free interplay between abstraction and figuration.

JO REITZE VAS FVAS

Former Art Coordinator at Canterbury Girls' Secondary College, Jo paints gardens on commission and is a tutor and judge. Recent awards include Heritage Award, Whitehorse Art Show, Best Oil Geelong Art Show, Borough of Queenscliffe Award and the prestigious A.M.E. Bale Prize for Works on Paper.

RON REYNOLDS

Ron's work has evolved over many years. The figurative elements are still present and he still relies on subject matter observed, but through exploratory sketches has developed a deeper more introspective approach to his paintings.

JENNY SCHOLES VAS

Melbourne artist, member of MSWPS and tutor at the Hawthorn Artists Society, Jenny has been in many solo and group exhibitions. She is represented by several galleries, the Alfred Hospital and in the Benetton collection in Italy

Jenny has a unique style using acrylic and ink and loves painting on large canvases.

CLIVE SINCLAIR VAS FVAS

Clive Sinclair was born in Melbourne 1951. He became interested in art and studied under John Lennox in 1973. The tuition with Lennox aroused Clive's interest in traditional painting and tonal aspects of art, and he became a student of Max Casey. Having studied for 12 months Clive travelled extensively throughout Europe and in 1975 studied art in London where he developed a love of the impressionists. On his return to Australia Clive resumed with Max Casey for a further two years and developed a deep interest in small, delicate watercolours inspired by Hilder, Sturgess and Clarice Beckett. The evening light which they captured in their paintings and the poetic beauty of their vision influenced Clive in his own work.

GREGORY R SMITH VAS FVAS

Gregory R Smith is a past President of VAS, Honorary Life Member and Fellow.

As an oil painter he always works direct from life, and has been a full time painter and art teacher for over 33 years. He has held 45 solo exhibitions and has received over 200 art awards for still life, portraiture, landscape, floral and life work.

ULRICH STALPH VAS

Ulrich Stalph is a German born Australian artist. He studied at academies in Germany and universities in Australia. Ulrich is known for his landscape paintings and his nude pastel work.

Ulrich is an exhibiting artist and has had solo shows in Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide. Ulrich has also won numerous painting and drawing awards. The scope of his work varies and can be found in both corporate and private collections.

URSULA TURSKY VAS

Ursula Tursky, a VAS member and signatory, is an enthusiastic member of the VAS Friday Group. A tonal realist painter, Ursula loves painting portraits in oil, including large portraits for the Norma Bull Award competition, with sittings stretching over many weeks. Ursula regularly exhibits portraits and still life expressions at VAS.

NINA VOLK

Nina studied at Art School for 8 years and received a BA in Architecture (University of Melbourne, 2015 with Award for Outstanding Academic Achievements), and later worked in Architecture and Fashion.

2022: received 'finalist' in 2 prestigious Art Competitions in Australia: John Leslie Art Prize for Landscape Painting (acquisitive, \$20,000) and Basil Sellers Art Prize (\$35,000 acquisitive); won fifth place in the WA Plein Air Competition; Joined WSV

2023: Best Watercolour, Bendigo art show; Best Landscape, Hastings art show; Joined VAS; First place Plein Air Eltham; Best in Show Geelong; Best Watercolour Hobson Bay; Best Watercolour Hamilton; Highly Commended Whitehorse

ERICA WAGNER VAS

Erica Wagner is an artist, editor and publisher. Her artwork is inspired by the natural world and a love of story, and she enjoys repurposing discarded work in her mixed media collages to allow unexpected imagery to arise. Her first picture book, *Hope is the Thing*, written by Johanna Bell, was published in 2023.

CHRIS WHITE

Chris White's painting is the result of the 'Academic' approach, in which Realism is his constant re-affirmation of a love for nature and natural appearances in differing light. Smaller works are completed on location and often result in larger compositions in the studio. He does not re-arrange elements to suit the 'picturesque', but searches for subjects which naturally fulfil his oeuvre.

JOE WHYTE

Joe Whyte is a Melbourne-based Visual Artist. Working in oils, his intricate works draw inspiration from the people, the places and the light of the place he knows best— Melbourne's inner-north. Joe has exhibited widely, and has been shortlisted for numerous awards both nationally and internationally.

RAYMOND WILSON VAS FVAS

Ray has been painting seriously for over 25 years and paints all genres: en plein air landscapes and seascapes; still life and portraiture. His aim in painting is to keep the artwork simple and 'painterly', that is, portraying the image before him with as few brushstokes as needed to create an image that pleases him.

ANGUS WISHART

Angus is a tonal painter in the constant pursuit of light. Largely self taught in oils, he is forever striving to capture light in paint, the way it falls on the subject, turning the transient moment into art.
