

Painting Landscape in Gouache with Marketa Kemp

Materials List

- A couple of landscape reference photos of your choice
- Gouache colours (Winsor & Newton Designer or Holbein are both good brands, Daler-Rowney is less expensive, suitable for beginners) :

Titanium white

Cadmium lemon (or Primary yellow)

Cadmium red (or Primary red)

Alizarin crimson permanent

Ultramarine blue

Prussian blue

Yellow ochre

Burnt sienna

Raw sienna

Raw umber

Ivory black

Optional: Cerulean blue, Cobalt blue, Venetian red, Indian yellow (or other warm yellow)

* If you already have a gouache set that includes primary colours, it is fine too.

- Water medium brushes or synthetic watercolour brushes : flats 1/4', 1/2' and 1', rounds #6 - #10 (pointy tip) plus Rigger or #2 for detail. My favourite brand is Princeton velvetouché.
- Pencil (graphite, orange, red or brown)
- Water cup
- Sta-Wet palette if you have one or any plastic or metal tray (white). A dinner plate is also fine.
- Rag
- Sheet of baking paper
- Paper towel roll
- Large sheet of Watercolour paper 260 - 300 gsm (cold pressed) cut into 4 pieces cca 38 x 28cm, or if you have a A4 watercolour pad, that is also fine.
- Masking tape
- Small spray mist bottle
