

VAS ART SCHOOL

There is no other place in Australia where you can stand and be surrounded with the spirit and history of the beginnings of Australian Art. Our unique art school offers classes where students share a building with five beautiful newly restored galleries. Students and the public are able to view exhibitions that display a wide range to styles and genres.

Our painting and sculpture classes cater to art students of all levels across a wide range of mediums including: oil, pastel, watercolour, acrylic, gouache, drawing and sculpture. Lessons cover a range of techniques, such as drawing, contemporary, portraiture, landscape, still life and life model.

Daytime, afternoon, evening and weekend classes are conducted in the VAS Studio by established art tutors. Students also have the choice between Regular Classes and Workshops.

- Class Terms are 8–11 weeks, based on the state schools' timetable. Classes run Monday to Sunday.
- Students need to be **18 years and over** to enrol in our classes.
- Art classes must be paid in full in advance. Please choose carefully when selecting a class, as we do not offer refunds or transfers except under special circumstances.
- Class fees can be pro-rated **in advance** for students who are unable to attend a full term. We will pro rata if 2 or more classes are missed and up to half the term. Exact dates of classes missed must be given.
- VAS reserves the right to make last minute changes to classes and tutors.

MEMBER EXHIBITIONS

Members can exhibit and sell their artworks in more than 11 exclusive exhibitions annually, including the Summer, Contemporary, Maritime and Portraiture, the Autumn, Winter and Spring Select Exhibitions, and the Artist of the Year. Selection criteria applies for the Autumn, Winter, Spring and Artist of the Year exhibitions. All VAS members have the opportunity to create their own artist profiles and present artworks for sale on the Online Gallery and Online Exhibitions on the VAS Website.

Members who take part in VAS exhibitions are eligible for a range of awards and prizes, including Highly Commended Awards and many sponsored prizes. We also hold a biennial portraiture scholarship, the Norma Bull Naturalistic Portraiture Award, and the annual Artist of the Year award.



This watercolour class is intended to be a relaxing environment, aiming to provide a series of exercises and demonstrations designed to extend students' understanding of the techniques of watercolour at each stage. New information will be added progressively so that previous techniques are retained and improved through continuous exercise.

Join us Monday afternoons for an unstructured session in our historic studio.

This course is ideal for independent learners who want time in the VAS studio to work on their own projects. Students will be encouraged to pursue their own interests and bring their own references, or use references available in the studio.

While the class will not have a strict curriculum, the teacher, Lucy Maddox, will be on hand to offer critiques, guidance, and resources, as well as direction for your art practice.

Graphite pencil is a wonderfully sensitive and creative medium to work with. Pencil art can sound simple, but it is more than a tool for creating preliminary sketches for painting. It is an art form that can be used to create drawings that range from incredibly detailed and realist to more abstract and expressive compositions. You won't need many materials, but with foundational drawing techniques you will be able to add texture, detail, light, shade, and emotion to your drawings.

Our aim in Term 4 is to focus on the natural world, from plants and trees to the living animal. Learn to draw with confidence and enjoyment the environment around you.



TUESDAY

The advantage of this traditionally inclined foundation is that the skills earned through the hard work of this kind of learning create a strong ability to draw and paint directly from observation with a grounding in the understanding of materials, colour, studio set up and art history.

Over the course of this program students will begin to develop skills in:

- Observational drawing (still life and models).
- Composition and spacial considerations.
- Colour Mixing.
- Understanding light and shade.
- Understanding the properties of art materials and how to best use them.
- Setting up a studio space at home and developing a routine to practice.



BEGINNING 4TH OCTOBER

In this class students will be instructed in the technique of oil painting in the traditional manner of tonal impressionism. Suited for beginner to intermediate students. Subjects covered include still life and portrait and figure studies. Students new to oil painting will be working with black and white and then progress to full colour as skills are developed.

Julian Bruere Drawing & Watercolour 3:30pm–5:30pm 2 Hours 10 Weeks Members: \$371 Non-Members: \$407 Class Code: 22-T4-07-BRUERE In these classes using the genres of Landscape, Seascape, Still Life, Figure and Portraiture, students will learn and explore watercolour painting through stepped demonstrations and supportive exercises. Some photographic reference will be supplied when needed, but other exercises will be imaginative. Instruction will vary from realism, impressionism, and abstraction with a respect for each individual's preference or style. Basics of watercolour will be revisited as required with demonstrations and painted examples. The nature of this class is to provide good painting foundations for the personal exploration and development of each student's style and subject.

Portrait & Figure in Watercolour 6:30pm–9pm 10 Weeks Members: \$439 Non-Members: \$477 Class Code: 22-T4-08-BRUERE This class is designed for painters to develop and explore Portrait and Figure in watercolour in the studio with access to a life model for some sessions and reference for others. The emphasis will be on developing personal styles and approaches in this subject with instruction and demonstrations on working with watercolour.


There will be a level of personal work and advancement with support from the teacher when a life model is present. At other times assignment reference will be provided by the teacher to practice and explore various aspects of the genre. Important painting instruction of Proportion, Balance, Scale, Colour, Technique, and Drawing will be covered across the term.

Drawing Fundamentals 10am–12:30pm 11 Weeks Members: \$474 Non-Members: \$513 Class Code: 22-T4-9-MADDOX Drawing is a foundational skill for all other art forms. This course will explore the basics of drawing in terms of techniques, subject matter and materials. Using still life, photographic references and live models, we will work through the basic principles of drawing, including line, tone, negative space, perspective and composition. We will also learn how to use the basic tools of drawing: pencil, charcoal, and ink.

A materials kit will be provided for all students, included with the class fees.

Paul's class observes the traditional approach to oil painting with a particular emphasis on tonal impressionist principles. Each term subjects include portrait, figure, flowers and still life, providing students with the opportunity to work direct from life, studying the relationships of tone, form and colour at their own pace. The class aims to advance students understanding of natural appearances, to define and classify their observations of subject matter, and to develop skillful control of the medium of oil paint.



Students new to oil painting will be working with black and white initially, then progressing through to full colour as skills are developed. A model will be used in some lessons. Having had some previous drawing experience is recommended for this class.



This course is designed to introduce to the student an array of tools in a gradual way to help simplify and make accessible various approaches to drawing. Students will first begin with copying a print of a drawing and eventually move on to working from a cast or still life, learning to translate the round to flat.

THURSDAY



BEGINNING 13TH OCTOBER

In this course, you will learn the fundamental skills of oil painting, embracing the range of approaches with this medium.

- Work from observation, including a live model and still life
- Study and create your own master-copies
- Gain an understanding of colour mixing, using a prismatic palette
- Work through smaller compositional colour studies through to a fully finished painting in layers
- Build an understanding of a variety of art materials
- This course emphasises a supportive learning environment that aims to empower you with the tools to execute your creative ideas. This is an approachable class for both beginner artists and for those wanting to expand their skill set.

This class is taught by the winner of our 2021 Norma Bull Portrait Scholarship.

Due to the tutor's availability, this course will commence from 13 October.

Regardless of your level of painting experience, these oil painting classes will offer 'direct from life' training in all forms of studio work.

Increase your degree of skill and artisanship through higher levels of visual learning.

The structure of each term will be adjusted to suit the students experience and knowledge. One half of each term will include models for portraiture or life work.

The 'direct from life' approach requires ongoing investigation and hence discussion on the various stages of the painting process. This will be a feature of each lesson, allowing the student to share concerns and better understand the principles involved.

Gregory has been teaching over 30 years, both studio and en plein air (outdoors).

This class will be operated in a supervised studio-style environment, where students will be encouraged to follow their own artistic interests and hone their skills. The class will feature demonstrations and weekly exercises, with a curriculum-based approach for students who are beginners or want more support. For those who are more confident, the teacher will provide oneon-one guidance and support during the course. As a teacher, my aim is to create an encouraging, open atmosphere with the appropriate instruction and assistance for each student's individual needs.



This morning watercolour class aims for the participants to expand their knowledge, skills and techniques in order to create their own artwork with confidence. The program will explore the many aspects of watercolour, starting with step-by-step demonstrations followed by hands on practice creating paintings from start to finish.

We will be working with a wide variety of subjects including landscapes, marine, figures, interiors, street scenes and still life. I will teach you traditional watercolour techniques that are particularly characteristic

of this beautiful medium—wet-inwet, drybrush, blending, washes and graded washes, lifting out and glazing. In addition to my own work, I will share with you through class discussion works by other artists.
